Circle Peak/Crystal Lake	Road Washout	Washed out White Chuck Road prevents access to trailhead.	Advocate for repair of White Chuck Road to its junction with Forest Road 27.
Icicle Gorge Loop	Road Washout	Massive washout on Icicle Creek Road precludes access to trailhead.	Advocate to increase USFS Recreation budget so that washouts do not preclude other
Headlee Pass	Damaged Tread/Water Crossings	Stream crossings on this trail are hazardous and tread is rocky, rocky and damaged.	Increase recreation appropriations in Fiscal Year 2009 to repair damaged trails.
Gee Point	Past Logging/Road Density	Extensive logging and road building affects recreational and wildlife values.	Advocate to decommission roads-to-nowhere and fund trail restoration programs.
Colonel Bob	Blowdown	Abundant blowdown at 1.7 miles renders trail impassable.	Increase funds for trail maintenance staff on Olympic National Forest.
Loowit Trail	Storm Damage	Enormous washouts render trail hazardous and unhikeable..	Properly fund the Monument's trail maintenance budget.

Middle and South Fork Cascade River	Fire Damage	Fires in 2003 damaged tread and rendered trail indistinct and difficult.	Allow fire-damage restoration funds to be used on trails damaged by fire.
Miners Ridge	Fire Damage/Abandonment	Fires and lack of Forest Service maintenance resources render trail extremely difficult.	Advocate for increases in federal recreation budget so that all system trails are maintained to
Foggy Dew Ridge	Illegal Motorized Use	Illegal dirtbike use has obscured trailhead and rendered higher elevations indistinct and difficult to follow.	Increase forest service enforcement resources commensurate with the needs on
Boundary Trail	Blowdown	A 4.5 mile section of this trail contains nearly 1,000 blown-down trees, rendering it impassable to hikers and stock.	Increase funds available to clear trails in deep backcountry areas.
